**DO THIS TODAY:** Markets are open. Spring side-dress nitrogen window remains open through mostly sunny then slight chance showers and thunderstorms. If you have N to apply on corn now at V5 to V8 stage, today's 81F window is your work day. Tomorrow's tonight low drops to 57F - cool nights help corn build root mass. In 1892, John Froelich of Clayton County, Iowa, built the first gasoline-powered tractor that could move both forward and backward and pull a thresher. He sold it to himself for the 1892 South Dakota harvest. The Froelich design became the Waterloo Boy, which Deere bought in 1918. Source: Smithsonian National Museum of American History.
