DO THIS TODAY: Markets are open. Spring side-dress nitrogen window remains open through showers and thunderstorms likely. If you have N to apply on corn now at V5 to V8 stage, today's 80F window is your work day. Tomorrow's tonight low drops to 65F - cool nights help corn build root mass. Source: NOAA point forecast + Iowa State University Extension agronomy guidelines.
