DO THIS TODAY: Markets are open. Spring side-dress nitrogen window remains open through mostly sunny. If you have N to apply on corn now at V5 to V8 stage, today's 89F window is your work day. Tomorrow's tonight low drops to 65F - cool nights help corn build root mass. Source: NOAA point forecast + Iowa State University Extension agronomy guidelines.

Hugh Hammond Bennett, the "father of soil conservation," testified before Congress on March 23, 1934, while a Dust Bowl storm darkened the room.
